

ACPWA's Street Sweeping Program



The Program

Alameda County Public Works Agency's Street Sweeping Program seeks to improve quality of life by enhancing the health and safety of the community it serves. To do this, the County routinely sweeps the 473 miles of roadways within the Unincorporated County. These roadways are broken up by zones, and each road within that zone is swept every 4-6 weeks.

COVID-19

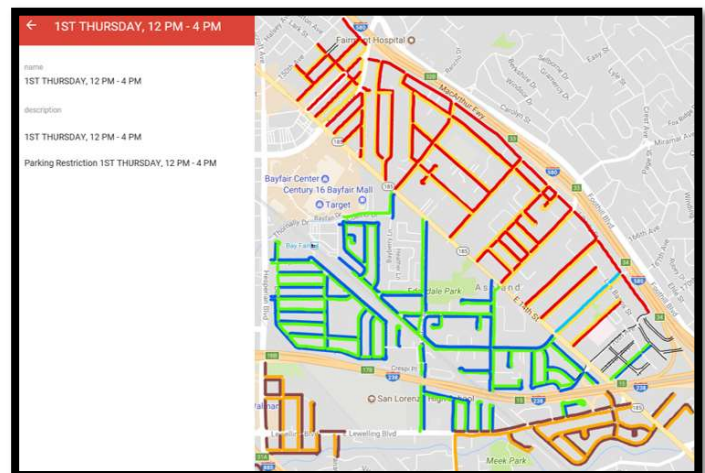
On March 29, 2020, the Street Sweeping Program was suspended due to the shelter-in-place orders to all Californians. Now that more residents are returning to work and businesses are re-opening, the Alameda County Public Works Agency will resume its street sweeping program.

Restart

Starting September 1, 2020, sweeping will resume for the posted area's within the Unincorporated County. We ask that residents observe and comply with neighborhood parking regulations. Enforcement of parking regulations won't begin until Tuesday, October 6, 2020.
