
What is a Community Based Transportation Plan (CBTP)?

- Launched by Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) in 2002
- Focuses on Equity Priority Communities to improve access and mobility for historically underserved and systemically marginalized groups (including people with low incomes, communities of color, and residents of Equity Priority Communities)
- Joint effort and in partnership with the City of San Leandro
- Focuses on the area which is generally within ½ mile of the Bay Fair BART Station and covers both Unincorporated Alameda County and the City of San Leandro
- Purpose is to bring residents, community organizations, government entities together to identify the community's transportation challenges and develop strategies to overcome them
- Strong emphasis on community engagement by prioritizing participation of the community members through various outlets (e.g. community meetings, focus-groups, tabling events, and surveys)

Study Area

What areas does the CBTP cover?

Generally includes the area within ½ mile from the Bay Fair BART Station






Bay Fair Priority Site Technical Assistance

What is the Bay Fair Priority Site Technical Assistance?

- **Priority Sites** are places close to services and public transit planned for a large number of homes that are affordable to households with a wide range of incomes
- November 2023, Bay Fair BART owned site determined as a priority site by MTC to achieve housing
- January 2024, Alameda County submitted an application for Priority Technical Assistance to conduct studies to advance development
- May 2024, Alameda County was a recipient of \$250,000, approved by MTC Commission
- The Bay Fair PSTA will include various tasks to inform the predevelopment process aimed to advance development on the BART owed property in unincorporated Alameda County



Bay Fair Priority Sites

- Unincorporated Alameda County: 7-acres of the property (highlighted in blue) west of the BART tracks (11-acres of the property is located in City of San Leandro to the east of the BART tracks and highlighted in yellow).
- Existing Zoning District: RS-D15
- Housing Element Site: Zoning Code amendment proposed for consistency with AB 2923 (sets baseline density and development standards for select properties)


Transit-Oriented Communities (TOC)

What is Transit-Oriented Communities?

- Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) policy to enact Plan Bay
 Area 2050
- Two Transit-Oriented Communities in Unincorporated Alameda County

 Castro Valley BART Station (Tier 3) and
 Bay Fair BART (Tier 2)
- Goals to achieve the following within ½ mile from high quality transit
 - Increase housing supply near transit
 - Increase density for businesses and commercial development near transit
 - Prioritizes bus transit, active transportation and shared mobility (such as bike share and car share)
 - Support and build partnerships to create equitable TOCs
- Supports two high-impact Plan Bay Area Strategies through implementing one of the housing strategies (H3) and economic strategies (EC4) to allow a greater mix of housing densities and types and allow greater commercial densities in growth geographies

Transit-Oriented Communities (TOC)

Compliance with Transit-Oriented Communities Policy

- Voluntary to comply with the TOC policy but will be considered in applications for regional funding (OBAG).
- **Compliance** will be measured in early 2026. Staff has submitted a grant application to MTC-ABAG and recipients will be notified in March 2025 (tentative).
- To be determined how compliance will be achieved for items such as relevant parking and zoning changes but may be done via a General Plan amendment.

Transit-Oriented Communities (TOC)

TOC Policy Categories

- Establish residential minimums and maximums in zones allowing residential (only on land without existing homes)
- **Commercial office minimums** and maximums in zones allowing offices (only on land without existing homes)
- **Remove parking minimums** and set maximums for new development
- Adopt and fund policies such as affordable housing production, preservation, and protection policies and funds, and to stabilize businesses to prevent displacement

Next Steps:

- Bay Fair Station Area Website is now LIVE and includes details on the CBTP, PSTA, and TOC Policy. A Listserv was also developed to sign up for e-mail updates
- **CBTP** efforts will begin in the fall/winter and staff will provide updates as soon as additional information is available
- Finalizing scope for the Bay Fair BART PSTA and consultants anticipated to begin work by January 2025
- **TOC compliance will be explored** by staff and direction will be provided by the Board of Supervisors
